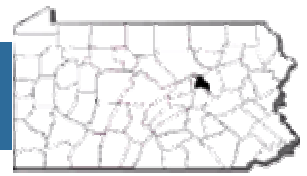

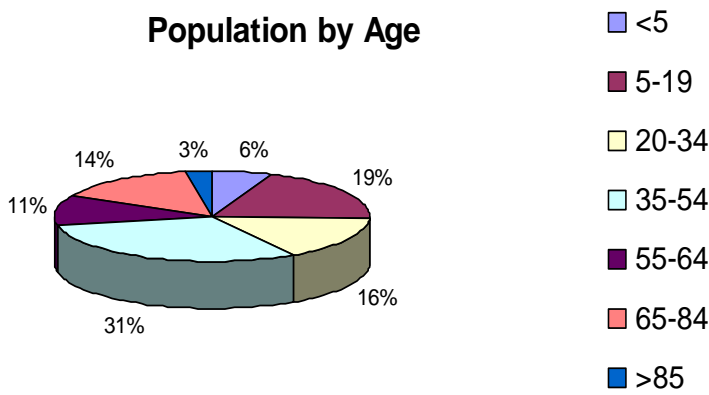

Population by Age



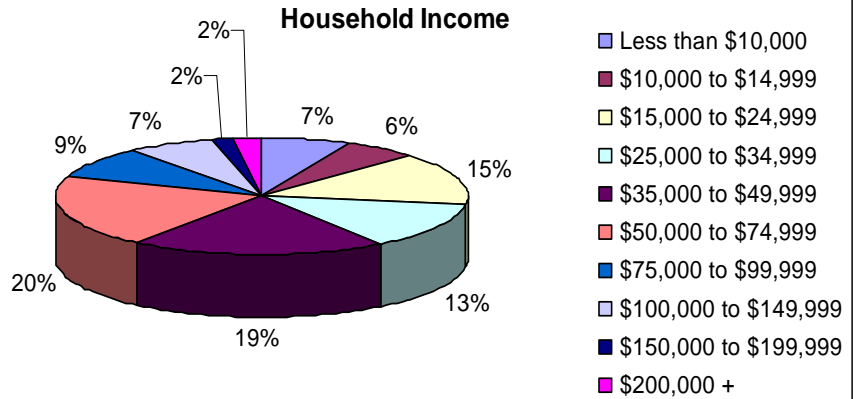

40% of the 11,667 individuals who WORK in Montour County also RESIDE in Montour County.

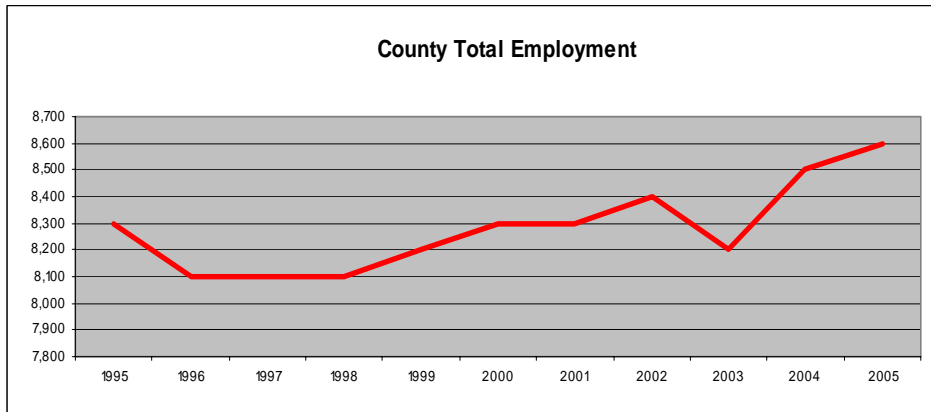
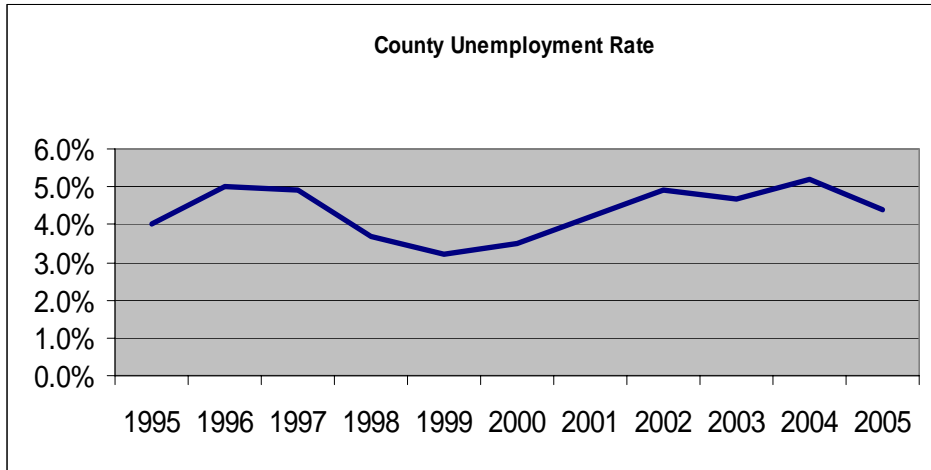
