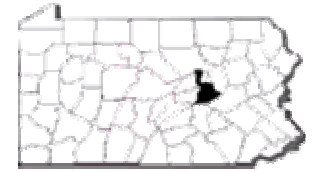

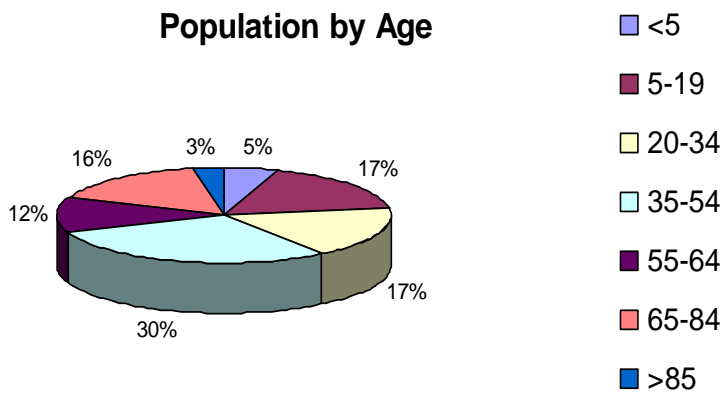

Population by Age



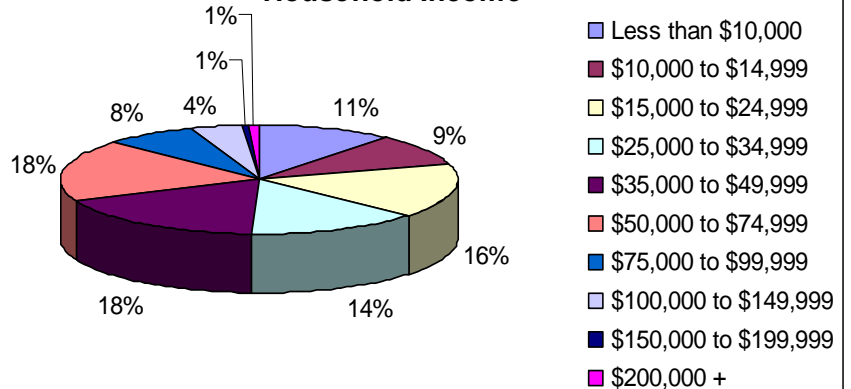

72% of the 33,222 individuals who WORK in Northumberland County also RESIDE in Northumberland County.

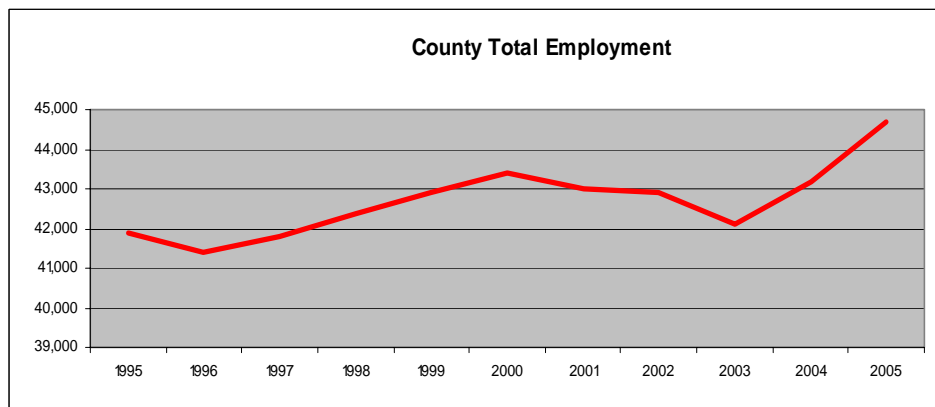
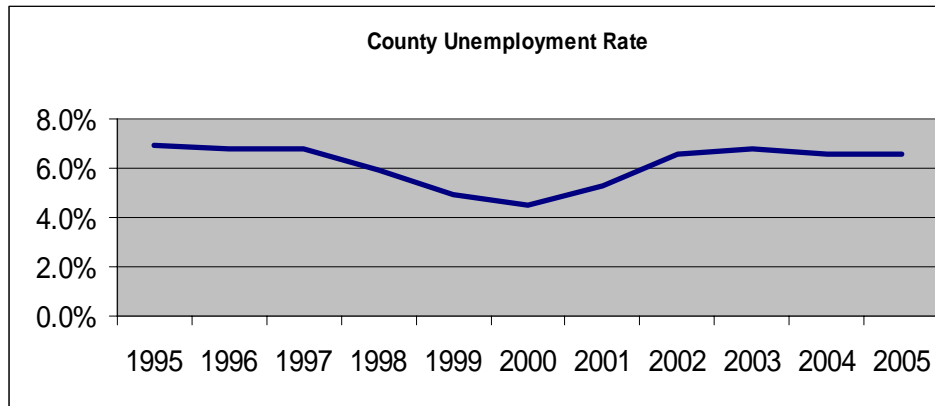
