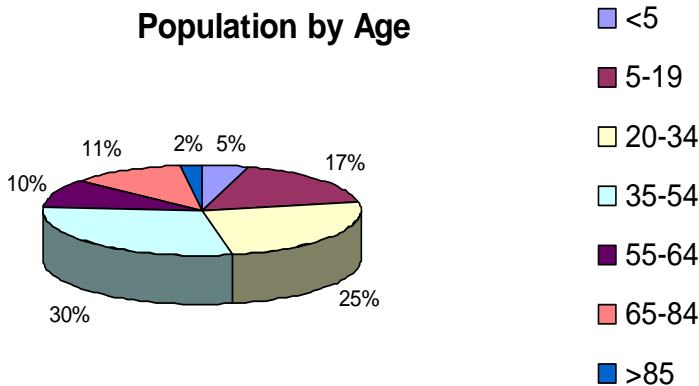

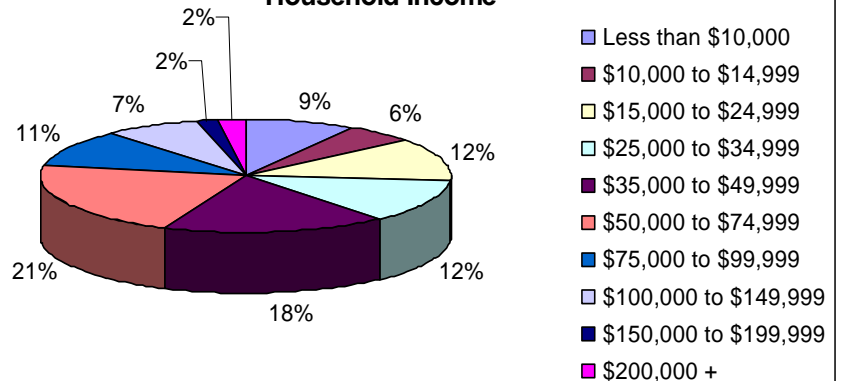

57% of the 18,453 individuals who WORK in Union County also RESIDE in Union County.

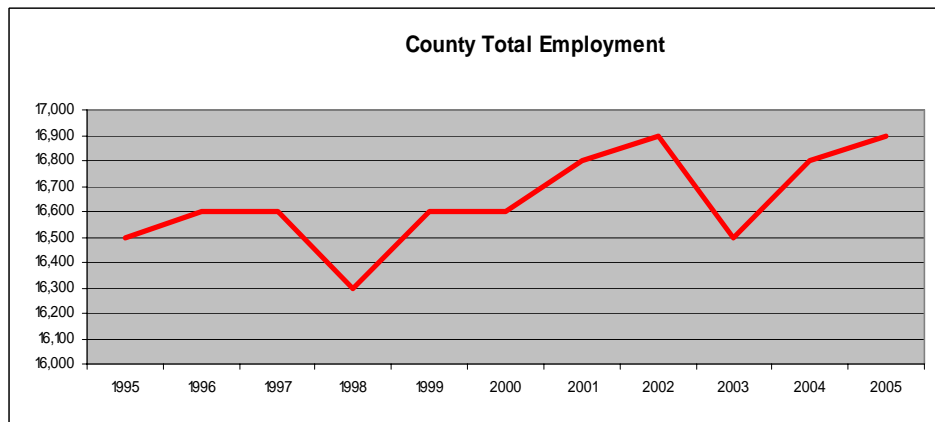
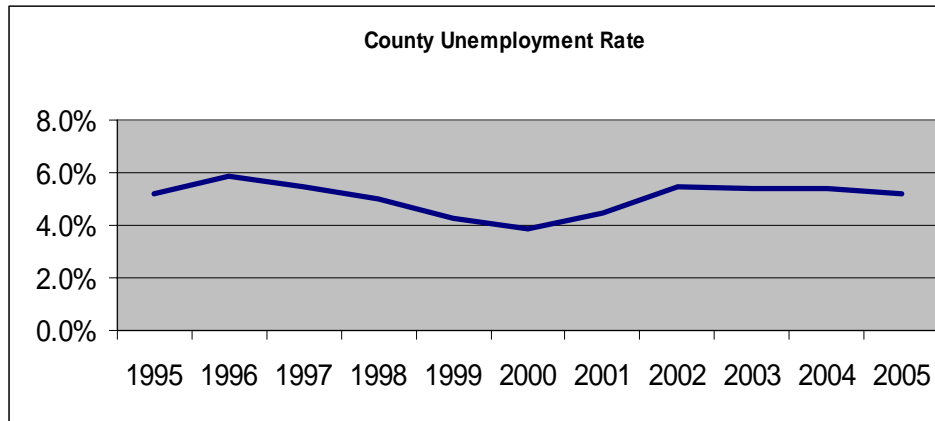
